REINSTATEMENTS

While most of us are conscious of the continual need for new petitioners for our degrees some overlook that there are many former members of the Scottish Rite in our Valley who could be reinstated or induced to affiliate with our bodies if they were just asked.

These men are an important avenue of additional strength for our Rite and we should not overlook any opportunity to induce them to petition.

The Grand Commanders restoration program by the Supreme Council is still in effect. It allows a brother who has suspended NPD to be restored without having to pay the past due dues — only the current year dues. The 2018 GC Reinstatement Program has been extended into 2019. The program waives PAST dues for members who are a) 75 and under and b) have been suspended NPD for more than 3 years. The members need only to pay the current years dues to be in good standing. As in previous years,. As of January 1st, 2019, members who were suspended NPD in 2016 are eligible for this program.

Do you know why you are required to sign your Dues card?

Most Masonic documents, including dues cards have the words Ne Varietur, usually placed on the size of the document with an appropriate place for the signature of the owner of the document. Ne Varietur. Latin, meaning: Lest it should be changed. These words refer to the Masonic usage of requiring a Brother, when he received a Certificate from a Lodge, to affix his name, in his own handwriting, in the margin, as a precautionary measure, which enables distant Brethren, by a comparison of the handwriting, to recognize the true and original owner of the Certificate, and to detect any impostor who may surreptitiously have obtained one. In ancient times, prior to the establishment of handwriting, one's 'mark' was used in place of the signature.
