THE SIGNIFICANCE OF JOHN THE BAPTIST

All lodges in North America are dedicated to the memory of the Holy Saints John. St. John the Baptist day is commemorated around the summer solstice in June and John the Evangelist day is commemorated around the winter solstice in December.

John the Baptist was known as a man of the wilderness and dressed in camel skins and ate wild honey and locusts. This leads many to believe that he was associated with the Essenian community which was principally located at Qumran, along the northwest shore of the Dead Sea.

As a result of the corruption of the ministry by the Hasmonean dynasty, a group of pious Jews withdrew from organized religion and formed a group by the name of the Essenes. The Essenes were very moral.

Thus, when Herod Antipas took his brother's wife (Herodias), such taking was condemned by John the Baptist. As a result, John the Baptist was imprisoned. During a drunken party, the daughter (Salome) of Herodias by her previous husband Phillip engaged in a very seductive dance which especially pleased Herod Antipas and he told Salome that she could have anything in the kingdom. She then consulted with her mother, Herodias, who hated John the Baptist and they agreed that they would demand the head of John the Baptist on a platter, and Herod executed this great man.

We revere the memory of John the Baptist today because he was a man of great integrity who spoke the truth without compromise. We as Masons should possess those same qualities and live a life worthy of emulation.
